Fairview Beloved,

One of the hottest places on earth is the Lut desert in Iran. In 2005, NASA recorded 159.3 degrees Fahrenheit - the hottest surface temperature found anywhere in the world. In the Lut desert resides the Ruppell fox (sometimes referred to as the sand fox). This fox has a low metabolism which helps at reserving water in the system. Amongst other adaptations. They have smaller bodies so it's not as much energy to move. All of it making them adaptable to extreme heat.

In the animal world, the only way of surviving is to adapt. It is necessary to eat and to thrive.

Not just in extreme heat, but in scarce food sources or seasons where predators are especially active.

I'd like to think humans are the same way. I'd like to think that when things are tough or when it is necessary that we can adapt to our environment and change for the sake of thriving in life. It's one of the many gifts God has given us - to be resilient, to change and to adapt. We did not become a strong species without this ability.

God is always asking us to adapt and to change. Sometimes we reluctantly do it and then look back later and see why. Sometimes we ask why first and then we reluctantly do it. And sometimes we refuse to do it and miss out on the opportunity to grow and become better humans.

Spirituality isn't something that grows without learning to adapt and change. Spirituality doesn't thrive if we refuse to ask the deep questions of faith and to be open to growing from asking those questions. We become closer and more connected to God when we ask questions and when we adapt. It's like it just opens a whole new world for us to explore and the more we explore, the more we learn about this amazing God who somehow designed this fox to survive the extreme heat.

As we move into our homes this Summer because the 100 degree weather is scorching us - may we take that time to ask ourselves some of the deep questions of faith - what is my purpose in the here and now? How can I move into a closer relationship with God? Is it possible for me to love God more and if I can, how? We could watch tv or read a book or take the time in our air-conditioned homes to perhaps move into another level of faith. I wonder what God is asking me to do?
